

Figure 3.1 Infant Mortality, 1870 to 1920





Figure 5.1 Annual Cigarette Consumption, 1970 to 2000





Figure 5.2 Annual per Capita Consumption, Three Year Moving Average, 1970=100





Figure 5.3 Smoking Prevalence, 2000 to 2002




