A center, according to the standard applied in this compilation, is a school which is used regularly at least one evening a week for two or more activities—or twice a week for one—not counting night schools. The various entries were obtained directly from local

school officials through a circular appeal which was sent to 1,229 cities of 5,000 population or over, according to the 1910 census. So far as is known to the compiler no city having school centers which meet the above standard is absent from the lists, but it may very well be that a few eligible cities failed to send in their reports and thus got excluded.

The extent of "wider use" undertakings in the United States is, however, much greater than is indicated by this Gazette. Among the reports received there were 162 schools which had to be excluded as not coming up to the standard set for frequency and quantity of activity. Undoubtedly also a large proportion of the cities which did not send entries have numerous schools in which parent-teacher, or tax-payer associations, community councils, and other neighborhood organizations are regularly meeting and in some instances actually supporting or conducting community center programs. The greater hospitality shown now by school boards toward voluntary associations and the tendency to simplify the letting procedure have greatly encouraged the use of school facilities by all sorts of voluntary associations.

That the school center movement is steadily growing is evident from the many cities which have recently organized or expanded school extension departments. Just what the rate of growth is, however, it is not possible to calculate from the data at hand. In previous estimates regarding the movement the number of cities reporting paid workers furnished the main basis of comparison. In the present report that number is not available for comparative purposes because it may, and very often does, include night school teachers. If the Gazette is compiled again for next season, as is the present intention, it will be possible to determine the progress of the movement with some accuracy by comparing the figures for the two seasons.

DISTRIBUTION OF CENTERS

An attempt has been made in Table 2 to show with what degree of adequacy the various municipalities have provided school centers for their respective populations. Since the 1915 population statistics were not available for all the cities, the figures of the 1910 census were used. The population per center is found in each case by dividing the city's population by the number of the centers listed. Since the resultant figures take no account of the amount of activity produced in a center they do not afford a basis for comparing municipalities on the score of the amount of energy or funds put into their extension

systems. They do furnish, however, a rough index as to how plentifully school centers of a kind are provided in the various sections of the country.

The additional centers enumerated in the last column are those which were reported as having a single activity, monthly, bi-monthly or weekly. Meetings of clubs and parent-teacher organizations and occasional lectures or entertainments were the activities most frequently mentioned. Since these centers fall below the standard of frequency they are not listed though they oftentimes indicate considerable additional extension work.

A number of cities have centers of a recreational or social character in structures other than school buildings of which no account has been taken.

EVENINGS OPEN WEEKLY

Twice a week is the commonest frequency with three times coming next. The complete distribution of the data on this point is shown in the following table:

ACTIVITIES AND WORKERS

It is not to be understood that all the lines of activity mentioned in the entry of a given center take place every night the center is stated to be open. According to the instructions, if an activity occurred as often as once a month it could be credited to the center. It would have been highly advantageous to have had the activities and workers per night open, but the tremendous burden which getting such detailed information would have laid upon school officials made it impractical to ask for the data in that form.

The method by which the workers were classified and counted is indicated by this excerpt from the instructions: "State the average number of each class of paid and volunteer workers in attendance nightly. Count all persons who *regularly* assist in the direction, management or conduct of the activities. Lantern operators,

ticket-takers, cloak-room attendants, regularly engaged at the center, and persons acting in similar capacities are 'workers.' Do not include the janitor (unless he does for the center something different from janitorial work), the musicians hired for a dance, lecturers or the performers at an entertainment. All regular staff members who receive no financial compensation for their school center services are volunteers. A worker who is paid by a philanthropist or a voluntary association although not by the school authorities is still a paid worker."

Since it is impossible to say in cases of night schools how many of the paid workers reported were engaged in evening instruction and how many in the other center activities no summary of the workers has been attempted.

LIBRARY BRANCHES

The number reported is 44. These do not include school libraries or any branches established in centers which are not open to the public in the evening.

AUSPICES

The number of instances in which the school board shares the management of a center with some local association is 227, approximately one-third of the total number. In certain instances, like Philadelphia and Detroit, a municipal recreation bureau or commission assumes entire control. The character of the organizations which were reported as engaged in operating or helping to support activities in school centers is shown in the following list:

SOURCES OF SUPPORT

One-half of the centers are supported entirely by public taxation ("city"). Over one-quarter of them are helped out by fees, i. e., paid admissions and other kinds of income received directly from the public in return for the enjoyment of an activity. Less than one-quarter are assisted by donations or contributions of one kind or another. A summary of the entries shows:

GENERAL REMARKS

The notes in column 10 of the Gazette are supplementary and explanatory. No special kinds of data were asked for under this head. It is interesting to note that the American Legion was referred to 3 times, Boy Scouts 41 times, forums 13 times, community singing 48 times, centers open on Sundays 11 times, and motion pictures 86 times. Of course in no instance is this a complete summary of the fact or activity in question.

*GENERAL NOTE—All centers noted as under auspices of a voluntary association are furnished free heat and light and janitor service by the city. Evening schools, public lectures and community centers are administered by three distinct departments. In cases where evening schools and public lectures occur in buildings used also as community centers all three activities have been stated in column 5, and columns 6, 8 and 9 modified accordingly. Increasing the number of paid workers (column 6) on account of evening schools, only 2 (the minimum number on duty "community center" night) were added in each case, the size of the staff of regular night school teachers being left out of account. This fact will explain the disparity between New York's figures for "pd." workers in night school centers and those of other large cities. The Public Lectures department maintains 20 one night a week lecture centers in schools which are not included in this list. The Evening Schools department maintains about 40 centers which are also not recorded here. These are open 4 nights a week, one evening weekly being devoted to club work, recreational and social activities, and known as "community center" night. In addition to the school centers listed, over 24 others were reported as having one line of activity weekly. There is also a vast amount of occasional use of school buildings by all sorts of voluntary organizations.
